Mrs. Mina Whiteman, widow of Orlando Whiteman, died unexpectedly at 11:30 o'clock Sunday morning at the home of her son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Potter in Garrett. Death was due to coronary occulsion.

Mrs. Whiteman, whose home was in Geneva, spent the winter months with her children. She had been in fairly good health, but had suffered a gall stone attack from which she seemed to be recovering satisfactorily. She was sitting up Sunday morning when she suddenly became critical and died almost before she could be gotten to the couch.

The deceased was a lifelong resident of this community. She was born in Jay county May 9, 1871, a daughter of Bolser and Emelia Kraner Gierhart. When a young woman she was married to Orlando Whiteman who preceded her in death in 1925.
