Harry F. Anderson, 73, of Fort Wayne, a World War II platoon sergeant and Korean War master sergeant, died Friday, Sept. 25, at home.

The Peru native was an Adams County commissioner, and a teacher at Stoney Creek High School and Geneva School. He was past president of Geneva Park & Recreation Board, West Lawn Cemetery Association and past manager of Wabash Valley Golf Course. He was a member of Indiana Teachers Association, Indiana Retired Teachers Association and Indiana Athletic Association Delaware Masonic Lodge, Scottish Rite Valley and American Legion Post 111.

Surviving are his wife, Esther; sons, Harry F. of Geneva and Tony D. of Berne; a daughter, Cathy Mitchel of Decatur; stepsons, Kenneth Miller of Fort Wayne, and Stephen, Larry and Terry Miller, all of Portland; a brother, Otto Edwards of Peru; a sister, Helen S.
