Herman N. Scherrer, 83, 505 S. Main St., Geneva, died Saturday morning at Parkview Memorial Hospital, Fort Wayne.

Born on Jan. 11, 1921 in Indianapolis to Leon N. and Pearl L. (Kaplinger) Scherrer, he was a 1941 graduate of Southport High School.

He served in the U.S. Navy from 1941 to 1944 and was stationed in Australia, Iceland, Newfoundland, and the Pacific.
