Arley D. Sprunger, 74, Geneva, died suddenly while working outside the Geneva Church of the Nazarene at 2:14 p.m. Thursday, apparently due to a heart attack.

He was born on January 13, 1917 in Adams County to Joel N. and Clara N. Ellenberger Sprunger and married Irene Cline of May 8, 1938; she survives.

He retired in 1979 after a career as a maintenance man at the Fort Wayne International Harvester plant. He was a longtime member of the Geneva Church of the Nazarene and served as its Sunday School superintendent for several years.
