

FUNERAL OF GENEVA MAN

Decatur, Ind., Nov. 21 - Funeral services for Samuel H. Teeple, 65, uncles of Charles Teeple, of this city, will be held Wednesday at the United Brethren church in Geneva. His death occurred at his home in Geneva yesterday, following a stroke of paralysis. Mr. Teeple was prominent in business affairs of his town, being one of the organizers of the Farmers & Merchants' bank at Geneva. He was formerly postmaster there and was connected with its business interests in many ways. His first wife was Cora McCollum, and two sons from this marriage, Jesse, owner of a Wisconsin shoe factory, and James M., shoe salesman, survive. He also leaves a widow, formerly Ida May Case, to whom he was married in 1912. Following their marriage they lived in this city for a short time.
