

Milton J. Fuhrman Is Taken By Death

Milton J. Fuhrman, 76, well known retired farmer of Root township, died at 3:45 p.m. Friday at his home, five miles northwest of Decatur. He had been critical ill for six days.

Born in Root township Oct. 12, 1888, he was a son of Samuel and Drusilla Dutcher-Fuhrman, and lived his entire life on the same farm. He was first married in 1912 to Saloma Rice, who preceded him in death in 1919. He was then married to Mary Drake Oct. 8, 1927.

Mr. Fuhrman was a member of the Mt. Pleasant Methodist church, and was a member of the Red Men lodge for 50 years. He served as Republican precinct committeeman from 1948 until 1964.

Surviving are his wife; one stepdaughter, Mrs. Thomas (Laree) Brass of Kokomo; two brothers, Joseph Fuhrman of Kalamazoo, Mich., and Maurice Fuhrman of Huntington; and three sisters, Mrs. Beulah Miller of Celina, O., Mrs. Rolland (Esther) Sprunger of Indianapolis, and Mrs. Ken (Lola) Cobble of Knoxville, Tenn. Three daughters and one brother, Norval, are deceased.

Funeral services will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Monday at the Mt. Pleasant Methodist church, with the Rev. E. J. Arthur officiating. Burial will be in the Decatur cemetery. The body was removed to the Zwick funeral home, where friends may call after 7 p.m. today until 12 noon Monday, after which the body will lie in state at the church until time of the services.

The Red Men lodge will hold services at graveside.
