MRS. HART DEAD

One of the Pioneers of this County

A Resident for Sixty Years

Was Nearly Four Score Years of Age

The Funeral to be Held Saturday Afternoon

Death has again entered our community and taken from our midst one of the oldest and best known women in the city, Mrs. Jacob Hart. The end came this morning at 7 o'clock after an illness of over a year's duration, during which time she suffered patiently and without a murmur, with cancer of the stomach. Mrs. Hart was born in Wayne County, Ohio on November the 1st, 1826, where she lived until she was a young lady, when her parents moved to Ashland County, in the same state. It was here that she was met by Jacob Hart, their marriage taking place April 2nd, 1846. The happy couple resided in this place until the year 1847, when they moved to Adams County, and for nine years they resided on a farm, where they prospered. In 1856 they moved to the city where Mr. Hart engaged in the brick business and later in the milling business in 1860, which he followed until a few years ago, when he sold out and has since lived a retired life. Mrs. Hart was a member of the Presbyterian church of this city and was a devoted Christian and an earnest worker on its behalf. The funeral services will be held Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the residence on Monroe Street, Rev. Fowler officiating and interment will be made in the Decatur Cemetery. She leaves a husband and five children, namely: Henry Hart, Mrs. Elizabeth Rice, Mrs. Mary Bremerkamp, J. W. Hart and Harvey D. Hart, to mourn their loss.
