J.D. Hendricks of Monroe, Dies

Prominent Retired Farmer Succumbs to Attack of Influenza, age 69, native son and one of the prominent retired farmers of Adams County, died at his home in Monroe at seven o'clock this morning following an attack of influenza and complications.

Mr. Hendricks took ill with the influenza about a month ago and last week took a turn for the worse. He gradually grew weaker and no hope of his recovery was extended by those acquainted with his illness. Mr. Hendricks was a native of Adams County being born in Monroe Township on August 26th, 1854, a son of Bazzel and Katherine Hendricks, the father coming to this county in 1848 and purchased his farm. In 1902 Mr. Hendricks retired from active farming and since that time has been living in the town of Monroe.

Funeral services will be held Thursday afternoon at 1:30 at the house and at 2 o'clock from the Friend's church at Monroe, the Decatur Knights of Pythias being in chare of the services. Burial will be made in the Decatur Cemetery. Rev. R.A. Johnson, of Linn will officiate at the services.

Mr. Hendricks is survived by his wife, who before her marriage was Miss Angie Martz, daughter of Jacob and Susan Martz of Monroe, and the following children: H. E. Hendricks, of Jersey City, N.J; Mrs. H.F. Major, Bryan Hendricks and Mrs. Guy Baker, of Fort Wayne; August C. Hendricks of Ft. Ringgold, Texas, a commissioned officer in the U.S. Army; Mrs. M.E. Babcock of Columbia City; Mrs. W.L. Lobenstein, Detroit, and Miss Cora Hendricks of Monroe. The following brothers and sisters also survive: J.A. and O.T. Hendricks of Monroe; Mrs. Hattie Sells, Monroe; Mrs. C.E. Albaugh, Dennison, Ohio; J.W. Hendricks St. Petersburg, Florida; Miss Jane Hendricks, Decatur.

Mr. Hendricks was a member of the Friends Church and of the Knights of Pythias lodge of this city.
