

DEATH CLAIMS DECATUR PIONEERS

Harlo Mann and Thomas Hudson, Old and Well-Known Residents of County

Decatur, Ind. - Nov. 30 - Two pioneers of the county, Harlo Mann, known from one end of the county to the other, and Thomas Hudson, one of the oldest residents of the city, are dead, their deaths occurring within twenty-four hours of each other.

Mr. Hudson was 75 years old. He had lived in this city since he was a young man. He had been in poor health for some years, suffering from catarrhal affection, which finally developed into tuberculosis.

Mr. Man was also 75 years and had lived in the county from his early infancy. He followed the plasterer's trade, but later moved on to a farm. He was also engaged in the grocery business for a time. For six years he was assessor and for four years trustee of the township.
