

## Decatur Daily Democrat, Adams Co, IN; Wednesday, September 26, 1979

James D. (Huey) Hueston, 32, route 3, Decatur, a special deputy for the Adams County Sheriff's Department for six years, a part-time jailer for eight months, and a 14-year employee of the Dana Corp. in Fort Wayne, was dead on arrival late Tuesday evening at the Adams County Memorial Hospital after suffering a heart attack at his residence.

Mr. Hueston had not been ill and testified in a court case in Adams County Court only Tuesday afternoon.

He was stricken at his home shortly before midnight.

Mr. Hueston was a member of IAW 903 and also served as a union steward; he was also a member of Decatur Moose Lodge 1311. He was also a veteran of the U.S. Marines.

Born in Decatur on August 11, 1947, he was the son of James R. and Patricia J. Ross-Hueston, and was united in marriage on Sept. 19, 1970 to Linda Teeter.

Survivors include the parents, of 315 South 11th St.; the widow; one daughter, Arendel, at home; and one sister, Mrs. Diana Koehlinger, Monroeville.

Funeral services will be conducted Friday at 10:30 a.m. at the Zwick Funeral Home, with Rev. Sylvester Martin officiating. Burial will be in the Decatur Cemetery.
