Elgin H. King, 74, retired business man of 511 North Jefferson Street, was found dead about 4:15 p.m. Tuesday in his garden, where he had been working.

Dr. W. C. Trapp, county coroner, said that Mr. King was stricken while using a hand plow and he ruled that his death was caused by coronary occlusion.

A son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Homer King, he was born September 10, 1883 in Harrison Township. He operated a confectionary store on West Main Street from 1925 until 1944 when he retired. He was a member of the St. Mark's Lutheran Church.

Surviving are his widow, Pearl King, whom he married October 23, 1911; a brother, Emmet King of Sanford, Mich., six nieces and one nephew. A brother, Al is deceased.

Funeral services will be at 2 p.m. Friday in the Alspach Funeral Home, Rev. Herbert Garnes to officiate. Burial will be in Decatur, Ind.
