

Death Claims Sarah Krick

Mrs. Henry Krick Dies This Morning After Extended Illness

Mrs. Sarah Krick, 84, widow of the late Henry Krick, and prominent pioneer resident of Adams county, died this morning at 10:10 o'clock at her home on Winchester street.

Death was attributed to a cardiac condition, following an illness of nearly three months.

The deceased was born in Fairfield county, Ohio, March 12, 1855, the daughter of Abraham and Catherine Mangold. She came to Adams county with her parents in 1865 and had resided here since.

She lived in Preble township until her marriage to Henry Krick June 18, 1874, when the couple moved to the present residence. Mr. Krick died July 15, 1927.

She was an early member of the Methodist church and an active member of the woman's home missionary society of the church. Always interested in the affairs of the community, she was an active member of the county board of children's guardians for more than 25 years.

Surviving are the following children: Mrs. John Parrish and Mrs. L. E. Dolch, of this city; Frank and George Krick, local business men; Walter J. Krick, superintendent of the city schools; Mrs. D. E. Butler of Fort Wayne, Miss Agnes Krick of Detroit and Mrs. John Nicholson of Chicago. Four brothers and two sisters preceded her in death.

Surviving also are 17 grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held Saturday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the home with the Rev. Ralph Waldo Graham, pastor of the Methodist church, officiating. Burial will be in the Decatur cemetery.

The body will be returned from the S. E. Black funeral home to the residence and may be viewed there from Friday afternoon until time for the funeral.
