Floyd Liby, 86, 201 W. Washington St., Monroe, a retired farmer and fuel truck driver for the Sinclair Oil Co., died at 9:10 p.m. Monday at the Adams County Memorial Hospital, where he had been a patient two weeks. He had been in ill health since last December.

He was a member of the Monroe United Methodist Church and a veteran of World War I, serving in the U.S. Army.

Born in Kirkland Township on July 29, 1895, he was the son of William and Amanda Breiner-Liby, and was married on Sept. 30, 1931, to Martha McKean; she died April 25, 1972. He married Marie Coppess on June 21, 1975, and she survives.

Also surviving are a stepson, Richard Coppess, Rt. 1, Monroe; a nephew, Robert Yost, Fort Wayne; a niece, Mrs. James (Alice) Bixler, Fort Wayne; a sister, Mrs. Calvin (Ida) Yost, Decatur; and five step-grandchildren. One step-daughter, Jean Colter, is deceased.
