**J. E. MOSER DEAD**

**James Elmer Moser, Well Known Photographer, Died Today.**

**DUE TO PNEUMONIA**

**Was Fifty-two Years of Age**

**Funeral Will be Held Saturday**

James Elmer Moser, one of the best known photographers of this section of the state, engaged in that profession in this city for twenty-five or thirty years, died this morning at 11:30 o'clock at his home, corner of Jefferson and Second streets. Death was due to pneumonia from which he had been ailing since Monday.

Mr. Moser was fifty-two years of age last August 18. He was born near Willshire, Ohio, but had been a resident of this city for thirty or more years, being engaged in the photographer's profession here during that time. He gained a reputation as one of the best photographers in northern Indiana, and was a true artist in that profession.

His wife, who was formerly Miss Mary Lucina Roop, died a number of years ago. One son, Ralph, is living. Surviving brothers and sisters are Joe, J. L. and Albert Moser; Emma, Ola and Grace Moser.

Funeral services will be held privately Saturday morning at ten o'clock from the J. L. Gay home, on North Second street.
