

DORA MYERS IS TAKEN BY DEATH

Mrs. Dora Myers Dies Friday Evening At Home Near Geneva

Mrs. Dora Acker-Myers, 72, mother of Mrs. Lois Black and sister of Miss Eva Acker of this city, died Friday evening at 5 o'clock at her home five miles northwest of Geneva. Mrs. Myers had been ill two weeks of influenza, which developed into pneumonia.

The deceased was born May 4, 1886 (sic; should be 1866), a daughter of Irvin and Jane Smith Acker of near Bobo. She was baptized in the Christian church and for the past 23 years resided on the farm near Geneva.

Preceding her in death were her husband, Charles Myers, who died 19 years ago, and one son, Professor Fred Myers of Notre Dame, who died recently.

Funeral services will be held Monday morning at 10 o'clock at the home, with Rev. Kenneth Timmons of the First Christian church, Decatur, officiating. Burial will be in the Decatur cemetery.
