A telegram from Rev. Clyde A. Myers of Deveron, Illinois says: "My mother, Louisa Jane Myers, widow of John W. Myers, died Monday night at 9:30, shortly after retiring. Not previously bedfast. Tentative funeral plans are for the funeral services to be held from the Decatur Presbyterian church Thursday afternoon at 2:30 (CST).

Mrs. Myers formerly lived for many years on Rugg street in this city and is well known. She was a member of the Presbyterian church and devoted much time to the various organizations connected therewith. Mrs. Frank Lynch of North Fifth street is a step-daughter.

Myers Funeral Here Thursday
Former Decatur Resident To Be Buried Here Thursday Afternoon

Funeral services for Mrs. Louisa Jane Myers, 77, former Decatur resident, who died suddenly Monday night, will be held at the First Presbyterian church in this city Thursday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock (CDT). The body will be brought to Decatur tomorrow and will lie in state from 2 o'clock until time of the services.

The deceased was born near Decatur February 2, 1864, the daughter of Samuel and Harriet Jane Allen. Her first marriage was to Frederick Roop, who died in 1904. She later married John William Myers, who died in 1915.

She lived in Decatur from 1916 to 1930 and was active in the Presbyterian church. Since 1930, she had made her home with a son, Rev. Clyde Myers, who is now pastor of the Presbyterian church in Divernon, Ill.

Surviving besides the son are a brother, William Allen of Newton, Kansas; a step-daughter, Mrs. Frank Lynch of this city and three step-sons, James Myers of Chicago, Cal Myers of Saginaw, Mich., and Karl Myers of Cleveland, Ohio.

Burial will be in the Decatur cemetery.
