

## Decatur Lady Death's Victim

Mrs. Amy Elizabeth Parr Dies at Noon Today after Long Illness

Mrs. Amy Elizabeth Parr, 74, a resident of Decatur for a number of years, died at her home, 329 North Ninth Street, at 11:50 o'clock Friday morning following a long illness.

Death was due to hypostatic pneumonia. Mrs. Parr had been ailing for the last seven weeks and her condition became serious Saturday.

She was a member of the Ben Hur Lodge in this city and of the Methodist Episcopal Church.

The deceased was born in Fairfield County, Ohio, March 9, 1858, the daughter of Peter S. and Hester Burr. She was united in marriage on November 11, 1878 to John W. Parr, who preceded her in death in 1913. Mrs. Parr moved to Decatur in 1889 where she had resided since.

Surviving are three sons and a daughter, William F. Parr, Pocatello, Idaho; Fred Parr at home; Harry of Fort Wayne, and Mrs. Laurine Berger of Fort Wayne. One son is deceased.

A twin brother, James Burr of Grand Rapids, Michigan and a sister, Rachel Krick of Lima, O., also survive.

Funeral services will be held Monday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock at the home, 329 North Ninth Street, with the Rev. B. H. Franklin officiating. Burial will be made in the Decatur Cemetery.

The body will be removed to the home from the S. E. Black Funeral Parlor, Saturday afternoon and the remains may be viewed after 7 o'clock Saturday night.
