MRS. PILLARS DEAD

Was One of Best Known Ladies of the City

Was Sick For Several Months

The End of Her Sufferings Came this Morning -- Funeral Services Sunday Afternoon

Mrs. William Pillars, one of the best known ladies of our city, died this morning at seven o'clock at her home on north Third street, after an illness dating back several months, death resulting from kidney trouble and inflammation of the bowels. Mrs. Pillars had an attack of lagrippe some time ago, which seemed to settle on her kidneys, with the above results. As she was unable to battle with the ravages of the same. She was born in Wells county, near Craigville, forty-six years ago, where she was reared and received her early education. She was united in marriage a number of years ago to William Pillars, and during their married life made this city her home. Although she had been known to have been sick, her condition was not considered serious among her friends, and her sudden demise came as a shock to the entire community. The funeral services will be conducted Sunday afternoon at three thirty o'clock at the home. Rev. Wilcox will officiate, and interment will be made in the Decatur cemetery.
