HARLEY J. ROOP DIES AFTER HEART ATTACK

Funeral Services Are Set Wednesday

Harley J. Roop, 64, a resident of Adams county most of his life, died of a heart attack early Sunday morning at his home one and one-half miles northwest of Decatur on the Winchester road. He was employed at the Decatur G. E. plant until two years ago.

Born in Dixon, O. March 7, 1886, he was a son of Frank L. and Anna Barth-Roop and was married to Goldie Butcher Jan. 2, 1917.

He was a member of the Bethany Evangelical United Brethren Church.

Surviving in addition to his wife are two daughters, Mrs. Eleanore Bieberich and Mrs. Pauline Rough(i/t)s (bad copy), both of Decatur; two sons, Harley Jr. of Decatur and Lawrence, at home; two grandchildren; one brother, Charley J. Roop of Decatur; a half-brother, Orval Roop of Decatur; a half-sister Mrs. Sarah Durbin of Decatur; his stepmother, Mrs. Nettie Roop of Decatur; a stepsister, Mrs. Herman Hoffman of Decatur and two step-brothers, William Smith and Jack Smith, both of Decatur.

Funeral services will be held at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday at the home and at 2 o'clock at the Bethany Evangelical United Brethren church, the Rev. F. H. Willard officiating. Burial will be in the Decatur cemetery. The body will be removed from the Zwick funeral home to the residence, where friends may call after 7:30 o'clock this evening.
