Oliver Schnepf, 83, a resident of 124 E. Grant St. in Decatur and a World War I veteran died suddenly at 5:50 p.m. Sunday at the Adams county memorial hospital.

Born October 9, 1891 in Union township to Solomon and Letitia Walters Schnepf he was a body and fender man with the Al Schmitt Dodge and Schwarts Ford Co., agencies for 35 years before retiring. Mr. Schnepf was a member of the Union Chapel United Methodist Church.

He was married on April 23, 1959, to Ruth F. Moser, who survives. Also surviving are one daughter, Mrs. Glen (Marcia) Neukom of Garrett; two sons, Lewis L. Schnepf of Fort Wayne and Kenneth M. Schnepf of Lansing, Mich; a step-son, Glenn D. Moser of Geneva; a step-daughter, Mrs. Robert (Harriett) Williamson of Warsaw; one brother, Kenneth F. Schnepf of Fort Wayne; 10 grandchildren and five great-grandchildren; eight step-grandchildren and eight step-great-grandchildren.

One son, Bell Schnepf, and four brothers preceded him in death.
