

Died Early Today.

Mrs. William Singleton Died at Family Home Northwest of the City at 6 O'clock Today. Complications the Cause Husband and Three Children Left to Mourn.

After an illness dating back several months, though her condition had not been considered serious, death came at 6 o'clock this morning to Mrs. William Singleton at the family home northwest of the city near the Mount Pleasant Methodist Episcopal Church. Mrs. Singleton had been about the home as usual last evening, and had helped her daughter, Mary Letitia, with the work about the home. Her death early this morning was therefore a shock to the members of her family and friends.

The deceased was born April 10, 1851 in Adams County, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Reuben Warner. She was united in marriage to Mr. Singleton 42 years ago last May 8th, and to them were born children, three sons and one daughter, one son Macey having preceded the mother in death. The husband, two sons, John of Albion and Jesse, living near the home place, and one daughter, Mary Letitia, residing at home, survive. One grandson, Luther, also resides at the family home, and there are nine other grandchildren. Two brothers are also living, John Kimmel and Jesse of Mishawaka. One brother and one daughter are deceased. Jonas Tritch of Fort Wayne is a nephew.

Funeral services will be held Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the home and from the Mt. Pleasant Church at 2:30, the Rev. J. K. Wyat officiating. Burial will be at the Decatur Cemetery.
