

**S. J. Spangler Dies Suddenly**

**Prominent Retired Farmer of Root Township Dies of Cerebral Hemorrhage**

S. J. Spangler, 65, prominent retired farmer of Root township, died suddenly at 4:30 o'clock this morning, April 28, 1928, death being due to a cerebral hemorrhage. The Spangler family resides near the Mt. Pleasant church.

S. J. Spangler, son of Jacob and Margaret Spangler, was born September 21, 1862 in Adams county. He resided in the same community throughout his entire life. In the year 1894, he united in marriage with Louise Armack, who survives him. Two daughters, Mrs. Bertha A. Thompson, of Lagro, Indiana, and Miss Iva M. Spangler at home, also survive. Mrs. Mary Henschen of Kirkland township and Miss Eliza Spangler of this city, are sisters of the deceased. Three brothers are: the Rev. Dan Spangler, of New Carlisle, Indiana; the Rev. Chas. W. Spangler, of Peru, and J. E. Spangler, of Root township.

Funeral services will be held Monday afternoon, at 2 o'clock at the home and at 2:30 o'clock at the Mr. Pleasant church.
