Belus Eugene Van Camp Dies This Morning After a Brief Illness

Belus Eugene Van Camp, 61, well known farmer residing in Root township, two miles northeast of this city, died at 5 o'clock this morning, following a brief illness of perforation of the bowels. Mr. Van Camp had been ill since last Saturday.

Mr. Van Camp was born in Allen county, December 29, 1861. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Van Camp. He was married twice, his first wife dying several years ago.
