Benjamin B. Winans, 75, died yesterday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the home of his son, Charles Winans, east of this city on the Maysville road. Mr. Winans was a Civil War veteran, enlisting when he was 15 years of age in Company M of the Fourth Pennsylvania calvary. He is survived by five sons and one daughter: Benjamin A., Livingston, Mont.; Herbert, Springfield, O.; Kenneth, Piqua, O.; Frank, Petoskey, Mich.; Charles, at whose home his died, and Mrs. Mabel Ortiz, Cleveland, O.; three brothers, 23 (or 25) grandchildren and 13 great grandchildren. The body was removed to the Klaehn & Sons' parlors and funeral announcement will be made later.
