D., of Berne, Ind. in the County of Adams Indiana, do hereby certify that I am duly licensed to practice medicine in Indiana; that I am not related by consanguinity or marriage to George Isac Macklin of said County, who is alleged to be insane and whom I have carefully and personally examined this 30th day of November 1956; that I am of the opinion that he is mentally ill and is a proper person for detention, care and treatment in a State Hospital; and that I have formed my opinion that he is mentally ill from the following facts observed by me. (Describe physical and mental conditions, appearance and behavior of patient.) flattened affect and personality response, somewhat retarded responses at times, emotional instability and schizoid personality

I have also received the following information from others relative to the patient's condition:

hallucinations, homicidal and suicidal

I certify that, in my opinion, said George Isac Macklin is the probable potential parent of mentally incompetent or socially inadequate offspring likewise afflicted. I feel it would be better this person be treated at screening hospital if possible, because of possible organic cause for his illness.

STATEMENT OF MEDICAL EXAMINER

I, Robert L. Boze M.D., of Berne in the County of Adams Indiana, do hereby certify that I am duly licensed to practice medicine in Indiana; that I am not related, by consanguinity or marriage, to Issac Macklin of said County, who is alleged to be insane, and whom I have carefully and personally examined this 4th day of November 19 56 ; that I am of the opinion that he is mentally ill and is a proper person for detention, care and treatment in a State Hospital; and that I have formed my opinion that he is mentally ill from the following facts observed by me. (Describe physical and mental conditions, appearance and behavior of patient.)

Listless & dull in response to questioning. Fair orientation as to time, but thinks he might be in Ft. Wayne, States he gets along fine with everyon. Positive Babiniki on left, ankleclonus pronounced on left, some on right Paralysis of left arm & leg exaggerated reflexes left arm & leg, Partial facial paralysis on left Blood pressure 200/110 H R * 80

I have also received the following information from others relative to the patient's condition: Poor judgement, un reliable with money; hallucinations; delusions; multiple threats of homicide, occassional threats of suicide

I certify that, in my opinion, said George Isac Macklin is not the probable potential parent of mentally incompetent or socially inadequate offspring likewise afflicted. There is a strong probabability of this mans mental illness being on an organic basis. I recommend he be admitted to a psychiatric screening hospital for further examination and treatment.

JUDGE'S ORDER OF COMMITMENT OR RECOMMITMENT

STATE OF INDIANA, Adams COUNTY, SS:

In the matter of the application for the commitment of George Isac Macklin to the Richmond State Hospital. No. 20474 (here insert court number), in the Adams Circuit Court.

Be it remembered that on the 7th day of December, 1956, the following proceedings were made, had and entered in the above entitled cause before the Judge of said Court:

Comes now Iva E Macklin, the applicant for commitment herein. It is now made to appear to the satisfaction of the Judge by the notice heretofore issued herein together with the return endorsed thereon that the respondent George Isac Macklin has been duly notified of these proceedings and when and where the same would be heard, said notice and return reading in words and figures following (H.I.).

This being the day fixed in said notice for the hearing herein this cause is now submitted to the Judge for hearing and examination in the absence of the respondent, he having failed to appear (or).

And said hearing being now concluded the Judge now finds that the respondent is in fact mentally ill, is a proper patient for treatment in a state hospital for the mentally ill, can be conveyed thereto without danger to life and that respondent's being at large is (is not) dangerous to the community, that respondent has a legal settlement in Wabash Township, Adams County, Indiana.

And this order shall be sufficient warrant and authority for the admission, confinement and detention of respondent for care and treatment in said hospital until restoration to mental health, or removal or discharge according to law. The clerk of this Court is directed to apply forthwith for the admission of said hospital, and to transmit with said application copies of all statements and certificates submitted herein, certified under this seal of this Court.

And the Court now appoints Iva E Macklin as guardian of the said George Isac Macklin, to take charge of his property, and orders said guardian to post bond in the amount of \$ nil , to the approval of the Court; (and orders this guardianship transferred to the Guardianship Docket Court for Administration.
