Roy Case, 79, dies at hospital

Roy Case, 79, of Willshire, O.; who retired from the Decatur General Electric plant in 1958 after 15 years of service, died at 7 p.m. Sunday at the Adams county memorial hospital. He had been seriously ill for two weeks.

Mr. Case was a member of the Willshire United Brethren church.

Born in St. Mary's township Adams county on February 14, 1894, he was the son of Joseph and Mary Ellen Watkins-Case, and was married on November 28, 1923, to Mary Stetler.

Surviving are the wife; five children, Mrs. Herman (Imolu) Lenhart, Mrs. Ann Laman and Bud Case, all of Decatur; Mrs. Lyle (Fern) Bailey of route 6, and Rev. Max Case of Marysville, O.; two brothers, Vaughn Case of Monroe, Mich.; and Rufus Case of Van Wert, O.; 20 grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. Two brothers and one sister preceded him in death.
