Delagrance.

Henry Delagrance, aged 59 farmer and blacksmith, of northeast of Leo in Cedar Creek Township, died of heart trouble at 4 a.m. today at the Lutheran Hospital. He had not been well since he suffered a stroke ___ paralysis last Fall. Mr. Delagrance was of the Amish faith.

Surviving are the widow, Mary A. five daughters, Mrs. Menno Witme____ and Mrs. Aaron Steury, both of near Leo, and the Misses Anna, Sarah and Barbara Delagrance, all at home; three sons, Christ, of near Leo, and Henry and Joe, both at home; a brother, Jacob, of Woodburn; two sisters, Mrs. Lizzie Knepp, of Montgomery, and Mrs. Barbara Steury, of Topeka, and eight grandchildren.

Funeral rites will be held Saturday at 9 a.m. at the residence. Burial will be in the Amish Cemetery near Grabill.
