## MRS. LORD IS TAKEN BY DEATH

Mother of Decatur Man Dies Last Night Near Fort Wayne

Mrs. Rosina Ann Lord, 60, mother of Solomon Lord of this city, died at 8:20 o'clock Tuesday night at her home in Allen county of complications resulting from an extended illness.

She was born in Berne August 16, 1878, the daughter of Solomon and Anna Burke-Neuenschwander. She and her husband Reuben left Decatur 18 years ago, moving to the present home south of Fort Wayne on Anthony boulevard, extended.

She was a member of the Zion Evangelical and Reformed church of this city and of the Pocahontas lodge of Decatur.

Surviving besides the husband are two sons, Solomon of this city, and Lawrence of Fort Wayne; one daughter, Mrs. Estel Dull of St. Cloud, Fla.; two brothers, Solomon B., and Noah M. Neuenschwander, both of Fort Wayne; one sister, Mrs. Frank Grieser, route one, Monroeville; and four grandchildren.

The body was brought to the S. E. Black funeral home in this city. The Pocahontas lodge will conduct a service at the funeral home at 7:30 o'clock this evening.
