Mariano F. Roman dies at hospital

Mariano F. Roman, 64, of Convoy, O., route 2, a retired mechanic and former resident of Decatur, died at 8 p.m. Saturday at the Adams county memorial hospital, where he had been a patient four hours after suffering a cerebral hemorrhage at his home.

He was born in Saltialto, Mexico, April 9, 1903, a son of Marcel and Aurelia Fuentes-Roman, and was married to Ernestina Hernandez Sept 20, 1926.

Mr. Roman was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church, the Holy Name society, and the Latin America club of Decatur.

Surviving are his wife; three sons, Ray and Ruben Roman, both of Decatur, and Reynaldo Roman of California; five daughters, Mrs. Raul Morales and Mrs. John DeLeon of Fort Wayne, Mrs. Paul Mato of Shelby, Mich., and Miss Emma Roman at home; one brother, Bonicia Roman of Mexico; one sister, Mrs. Beneta Roman of Mexico; 29 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday at St. Mary's Catholic church, with the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Simeon Schmitt officiating. Burial will be in Greenlawn cemetery at Fort Wayne. The body was removed to the Gillig-Doan & Sefton funeral home, where friends may call until time of the services. The rosary will be recited at 8 o'clock this evening.
