I know all men by these presents, that we Benj<sup>a</sup>, F. Blossom  
John Guessinger James Crabs and Alex<sup>r</sup>, Fleming  
all of Adams County and State of Indiana, are held  
and firmly bound unto William Borem of the County  
aforesaid, in the sum of fifty dollars, for the payment  
of which well and truly to be made and done, we bind  
ourselves, our heirs, Executors and administrators, jointly  
and severally, firmly by these presents, Sealed with our  
seals, and dated this 8<sup>th</sup> day of June 1841

The Condition of the above obligation is such,  
that whereas the above bound Benj<sup>a</sup>, F. Blossom and  
John Guessinger has this day appealed to the Adams  
Circuit Court, from the judgement of Abraham  
Dehaven, a justice of the peace of said County,  
lately ~~made~~ rendered in favour of the said William  
Borem, against him the said Benj<sup>a</sup>, F. Blossom and  
John Guessinger, now, if the said Benj<sup>a</sup>, F. Blossom  
and John Guessinger will prosecute his said appeal  
with effect, and pay the full amount of the  
Condemnation money and costs in case judge-  
ment be given against him in the said Circuit  
Court then the above obligation is to be void  
and of none effect, other wise to be and remain  
in full force and virtue in law
