complains of John Stratt, the defendant in
this action and says—

Paragraph 1. That said defendant on the
2^d. day of October 1853, by his promissory
note of that date, a copy of which is filed
herewith, promises to pay to one Samuel
Poling, or order, the sum of Thirty Dollars
and Forty cents, three years from the date of said
note—that the said Samuel Poling, heretofore
towl: on the day of 185 assigned said
note to plaintiff without endorsement and
that the same remains wholly unpaid

Paragraph 2. Said plaintiff further complain-
ing of said defendant says, that on the 28^d. day
of October 1853, said defendant, by his other
promissory note of that date, a copy of which
is filed herewith, promises to pay said Samuel
Poling the order, the further sum of Thirty Dollars
and Forty cents, four years from the date thereof
— that heretofore towl: on the day of
185 said Samuel Poling assigned said note to plain-
tiff without endorsement and that the same
remains wholly unpaid. Wherefore and

for said several causes of action plaintiff
demands Judgment for One Hundred Dollars
and that the said Samuel Poling be made a
party defendant, ^{in this action} and that he be summoned
and required to appear thereto according to
Law, and ~~Answer~~ ^{Answer} to his interest in the assign-
ment of the notes mentioned in the first and
second paragraphs of this Complaint, and as
to his interest in the subject matter of this
action to other and further proper relief.
