Samuel R. Chandler and Martin Chandler, administrators of all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits, which were of Martin Chandler late of Muskingum County in the State of Ohio, deceased at the time of his death, who died intestate, complain of Sally Turner, Administratrix of all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits of John Turner, late of said County of Adams, deceased who died intestate &c. in a plea of Assumpsit, For that whereas the said John Turner in his lifetime <sup>at Adams County aforesaid</sup> to wit on the 19th. day of December AD 1829, <sup>made</sup> his one bill in writing, and then and then ~~delivered~~ <sup>delivered</sup> the same to the said Martin Chandler, and then and then thereby promised the said Martin Chandler to pay him the sum of forty six dollars and twenty one cents,

And also for that whereas the said John Turner in his lifetime, to wit on the day and year last aforesaid, <sup>at the County of Adams aforesaid</sup> was indebted to the said Martin Chandler in the further sum of forty six dollars & twenty one cents, for money found to be due from the said Turner to the said Chandler upon an account then and then stated between them, and in consideration thereof then and there, promised the said Chandler, to pay him that sum on demand,

Yet the said Turner in his lifetime and the said Administratrix as aforesaid, after the death of the said John Turner, not regarding the said promise, hath not paid the said sum of money nor any part thereof, but the

the same remains unpaid.

To the damage of the said Plaintiff one hundred & fifty Dollars & therefore they sue.

And the said Samuel R Chandler and Martin Chandler, bring into Court here, duly certified evidence of their appointment and authority to act as the Administrators of the said, &c.
