Carrington will injure him self or any one of his family or his property by violence and that he makes this Affidavit only to secure the protection of the Law and not from malice or anger

Served by bringing Prissinars in to Court
fees two dollars ninety two cents

He it remembered that on the 14th day
of August 1848 went in to an examination
of the case of Thomas Lincoate against
Lem's Bishir Complainant called his witnesses
and had them sworn after an examination
of Complainant's witnesses dependent

had his called and sworn
the case being submitted for
for decision this Court thinks
the complainant has just cause to
hear as expressed in his affidavit
and that the prisoner
Lewis Bishir enter in to recognizance
to appear before the next Court
of Common Pleas of Adams County
and pay cost of this suit
bonded at eight dollars dated the
18th day of Aug 1858

to the State of Indiana in the penal
sum of three hundred dollars each
if said Lewis Bishir shall not appear
at the first day of the next term
of the Court of Common Pleas of
Adams County to answer a complaint
of Surety of the Peace made against
him by Thomas Livecoate and abide
the order of such Court therein and
in the meantime keep the peace
toward all the inhabitants of this state
