Radolph Hauffer Complains  
of John Christian and says that the defendant on the twenty  
sixth day of March, A.D. 1832, by his oral and written obligation  
in the common language of the day, with its translation,  
is, to wit, promising to pay the plaintiff according to  
the law an effect of said obligation, six hundred and  
sixty cents and sixty six hundred which is the sum of  
one hundred and sixty one dollars and twenty cents, which  
remains unpaid and the plaintiff demands judgment  
for the sum of two hundred dollars.

Radolph Hauffer Complains of John Christian  
and says that the defendant owes him forty dollars for goods  
personal property sold and delivered by the plaintiff to the defendant  
for use and labor and materials furnished by the plaintiff to  
the defendant the particulars of which are set forth in an account  
find hereunto being due and unpaid the sum of forty dollars  
for which the plaintiff demands judgment for three hundred  
dollars
