

State of Indiana Whereas by virtue of a certain writ of capias ad Rev
Adams County { ss } -poundam issued out of the Circuit Court of Ad
ams County in the State of Indiana to the Sheriff of Adams County in said
State directed, the said Sheriff is commanded to take into his custody one James
Wilson if he may be found in his bailiwick & him safely keep & have his
body before the judges of the Adams Circuit Court on the first day of the next
Term thereof to be held at the Court House in the Town of Decatur in said
County of Adams on the second day of December next to answer unto the
said State of Indiana in an Indictment for selling Spirituous Liquor to an Intox-
icated person pending against him in said Court. And whereas also by a cer-
tain written endorsement on the back of said writ under the hand of the
Clerk of said Court the said Sheriff is directed to set the said James Wilson to
bail in the sum of twenty five dollars. And whereas also as commanded by Alvan
Randall dep. Sheriff of the said County of Adams have taken into my custody the
body of the said James Wilson on the 1st day of October 1840. Therefore be it remembered
that on the 1st day of October 1840 personally came before me Alvan Randall dep. Sher-
iff of the said County of Adams the said James Wilson and Enos Mann
who severally acknowledged themselves to be indebted to the said State of Indiana in the
sum of twenty five dollars, each to be levied on their goods & chattels lands & tenements
if default be made in the condition following which condition is that the said
James Wilson shall personally be & appear before the judges of the Adams
Circuit Court on the first day of the next Term thereof to be held at the
Court House in the Town of Decatur in the said County of Adams on the
second day of December next to answer unto the said State of Indiana
in an Indictment for selling Spirituous Liquor to an Intoxicated person & abide
the judgment of the said Court thereon & not depart therefrom without
leave of said Court.

State of Indiana, Adams circuit Court
Adams County in April term 1840.

The Grand jurors, ^{of the said State of Indiana} impanelled charged
and sworn in the said Adams circuit Court
to enquire witness and for the body of the
said County of Adams upon their oaths
present. That James Wilson late of said
County, dwelt near on the twenty-fifth day of
December eighteen hundred and thirty-eight with
force and arms at the County aforesaid, and
within the jurisdiction of the said Adams circuit
Court, then and there being a licensed Tavern keeper
and then and there having a license according to Law
to retail Spirituous and Strong Liquors, did then and
there unlawfully suffer and permit divers persons
to play at and upon a certain unlicensed game
and wagers commonly called raffling at and
for one Turkey of the value of one Dollar, within
the Tavern house of him the said James Wilson
Contrary to the form of the Statute in such case
made and provided, and against the peace and
quietty of the State of Indiana.

And the jurors aforesaid by their
oath aforesaid do further present, that James
Wilson late of said County of Adams dwelt on
the first day of December eighteen hundred and
thirty-eight with force and arms at the said County
and within the jurisdiction of the said Adams
circuit Court, then and there being a licensed Tavern
keeper, and then and there having a license according
to Law to retail Spirituous and Strong Liquors
did then and there unlawfully suffer divers persons
to loose and win an article of value to wit one
Turkey of the value of one Dollar of them and



There is unmercifully betting and wagering the said
turkey, at and upon a certain unlawful game
and wager commonly called raffling in the
tavern house of him the said James Milon
Contrary to the form of the Statute in such
cases made and provided and against the
peace and dignity of the said State of
Indies.
