The Grand Jurors for the said State of Indiana, impannelled charged and sworn in the said Adams circuit court, to enquire in and for the body of the same said county of Adams upon their oath present That James Wilson late of said county Inn-keeper on the thirteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty, with the force and arms, at the ^{said} county of Adams, did unlawfully sell and dispose of a certain spirituous and intoxicating liquor, to wit, one quart of spirituous and intoxicating liquor, at and for the sum of twenty five cents to an indians whose name is to the Grand Jurors unknown contra to the form of the statute in such case made and provided and against the peace and dignity of the said State of Indiana
