The Grand Jurors for the said State of Indiana, empanelled, charged and sworn in the said Circuit Court, to enquire in and for the body of the same said county of *Adams* upon their oath present, that ~~Samuel Henningsen~~ *James Wilson* late of said county, on the ~~first~~ *fortyone* day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and within the jurisdiction of the said *Adams* Circuit Court, in and upon the body of one *Thomas*, in the peace of the said State of Indiana then and there being, did make an assault, and *him* the said *Thomas*, in a rude, insolent and angry manner, did then and there unlawfully touch, strike, beat, wound and ill-treat, and other wrongs to *him* the said *Thomas* then and there unlawfully did; to the great damage of said contrary to the form of the Statute in such cases made and provided, and against the peace and dignity of the said State of Indiana.

The Grand Jurors for the said State of Indiana, empanelled, charged and sworn in the said Adams circuit court, to enquire in and for the said county of Adams, upon their oath present that James Wilson late of said county, Publican, on the third day of March in the year of our Lord, eighteen hundred and forty, with force and arms at the said county of Adams, did unlawfully sell and dispose of a certain spirituous and intoxicating liquor, to wit one drink of spirits, and intoxicating liquor, at and for the sum of ~~one~~ cents to an Indian whose name is to the Grand Jurors unknown, contrary to the form of the statute in such case made and provided and against the peace and dignity of the said State of Indiana

State of Indiana in the sum of fifty dollars each to be levied on their goods &
chattels lands & tenements if default be made in the condition following
which condition is that the said James Wilson shall personally be & appear
before the judges of the Adams Circuit Court on the first day of their next Term
to be holden at the Court House in the Town of Decatur in said County on the
second day of November next to answer unto the said State of Indiana in an
Indictment for Retailing Spirituous Liquor to an Indian and abide the judgme-
nt of said Court thereon & not depart therefrom without leave of said Court.
