






payment well and truly to be made, we bind our-  
selves, our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly  
and severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our  
Seals, and dated this 10th day of May A.D. 1847.

Whereas, Mary Sewton Plaintiff, recovered a  
judgment against the above bound Stephen S Rugg  
defendant before Andrew Soberty Esq. a justice of the  
peace of Root township, in the County of Adams for  
\$ 7.03 cents damages and \$ 8.67 cents costs; and  
the said Stephen S Rugg conceiving himself aggriev-  
ed by such judgment, hath appealed therefrom  
to the Circuit Court of said county; now therefore, the con-  
dition of this obligation is such, that if the said Stephen  
S Rugg shall prosecute his appeal to effect, with due  
diligence, and without unnecessary delay, and if he  
will pay the condemnation money and costs which  
may be adjudged or awarded against him, on the  
appeal in such case in the circuit court if judgment  
be there given against him, then this obligation to be  
void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue,
