

of Indiana to appear in the Adams Court of Common
Pleas of Adams County, in said State, at any regular term
of said Court, or in any other Court of Record in said
County, and make the issue and service of process, and
Confess judgment against me and in favor of Joseph
H. Puttnam for the Sum of Two Hundred Forty four Dollars
and Seventy four Cents And thereupon to release all errors
and waive all right and benefit of appeal in my behalf
which Confession is the amount due upon a note a Copy
of which is herewith annexed, without relief from valuation or appraisment.
