Adams County, To wit:

The Grand Jurors for the Said State of Indiana im-
pannelled, charged, and sworn in the Said Adams Circuit Court to
enquire in and for the body of the Said county of Adams, upon
their oath the present That on the second day of November in the year of
our Lord eighteen hundred and forty a general election was held through-
out the State of Indiana for the purpose of electing nine electors of
President and Vice President of the United States: and the Grand Jurors
aforesaid, upon their oath aforesaid do further present, that more
than ten days previous to said election, to wit, on the first day
of October in the year aforesaid, at the county of Adams aforesaid,
the Board doing county business in the Said county of Adams, caused
certain blank forms of poll books and election returns to be made
out ^{read} and certified suitably for the Said General Election of Presidential
Electors, for the Judges of the election in Monroe Township in said
county of Adams, which said ^{blank forms of} poll books and election returns they
the Said Board doing county business then and there caused to be
delivered into the hands of Alven Randall who ~~was~~ then and
there ~~was~~ from that time forward continually until the finding
of the Indictment, Sheriff of said county of Adams duly elected and
qualified as such: And the Jurors aforesaid upon their oath aforesaid
do further present that the said Alven Randall Sheriff as aforesaid, on
the said first day of October, in the year aforesaid, and from that
time forward continually until the finding of this Indictment,
at the county aforesaid, did utterly fail, neglect and refuse to
deliver the said blank forms of poll books and election returns
to the Judges of elections of the said Township of Monroe in said
county or to either of them, contrary to the form of the Statute
in such case made and provided and against the peace and
dignity of the Said State of Indiana
