1. Such written instrument purporting to be the Last Will and Testament of such decedent, be and it is hereby admitted to probate and recorded as such.

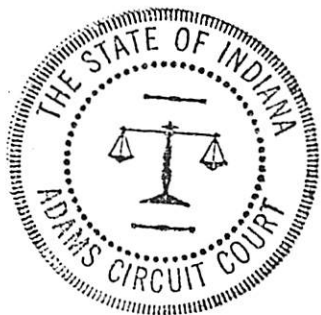
2. That said Helen Keller is appointed as personal representative of the estate of Ethel Alexander and is not required to post bond.
