State of Christian Adams County vs. On the Court of Common Pleas November Term 1859 Estate of Jonathan H. Andrews Adm. Thomas H. Andrews Administrator of Jonathan H. Andrews deceased report to the Court that he did in obedience to the Court sell the lands ordered to be sold on the 24th day of September 1859. between the hours of ten O'clock A.M. and 1 O'clock P.M. on said day and sold the same to Joseph G. Mallonee for the sum of Eighty Dollars which was more than the two thirds of the appraised value of said land and he paid one third of said sale in hand and the residue is secured.

From which said Report it appears that the requisite legal notice of the time & place of sale was duly given, by a publication in the Deccator (aged a weekly newspaper printed and published in said County of Adams which said notice and proof of publication and in words & figures following to wit; (It is) And by posting notices at four public places in said County, three of which were set up in the Town Ship where the land is situated, three weeks prior to the day of sale, which said notice and proof is setting up and in words & figures following to wit (It is) And it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that said sale has been conducted in all respects in accordance with the order of said Court, heretofore made in this behalf, and in compliance with the Statute in such cases made & provided. It is therefore ordered adjudge & determined by the Court, that the sale so made in this behalf be and the same is in all things confirmed, by the Court. And on motion the matter is continued.
