November in the year 1845 personally appeared  
before me L. Mattay a Justice of the Peace  
of Monroe Township Adams County Pa.

says that he heard Adam Baker say in his lifetime

~~that he would pay Isaac Bakers note that he~~  
holds against Daniel Baker his son and also  
all of his debts with the exception of his  
Doctor Bill Isaac Nelson

administrator of the estate of Adams Baker deceased, according  
to law, then the above obligation is to be void and of none  
effect, otherwise to be and remain in full force and virtue  
in law.
