to law. It is therefore ordered that said Final Settlement  
Report be in all things confirmed and that said Administrator  
be discharged from all further accountability to the Court  
on account of said Estate and from all further liability on  
his Bond or such Administrators. And it is ordered that  
Surplus for distribution to wit the sum of three hundred & 8  
seventy five dollars and seventy nine cents which sum is paid  
into the clerks office of the Court. It is ordered by the Court that  
the Clerk give the requisite notice in the behalf that at the next  
term of the Court the Surplus will be distributed according to  
law. All of which is ordered & adjudged & determined  
by the Court. And this Motion is Court record by  
operation of law.
