itted to ~~them~~ him as administrator of the estate
of Nancy Blossom deceased according to law
and will truly and promptly deliver over to
his successor to be appointed by the Probate
Court of said County should any such
successor even hereafter be appointed, all
such estate, goods chattels and assets, and assign
to such successor all such rights and credits
as shall of right belong to such successor
upon reasonable demand made thereof
then the above obligation is to be void and
of none effect otherwise to be and remain in
full force and virtue in law
