

ANSWER TO WITHDRAWAL AND
RENUNCIATION OF WAIVER OF

Comes now Donald D. Bohnke as Personal Representative of the Estate of Frank E. Bohnke, deceased, by Counsel, and for Answer to the Withdrawal and Renunciation of Waiver of Right to Take Against Will is filed in the above captioned Estate on the 26th day of February, 1982, says:

1. That he denies each and every material allegation of the several rhetorical paragraphs of said Withdrawal and Renunciation.
2. That the Waiver of Right to Take Against Will of Candace R.
