That at the time of decedents death he had in his hands and turned over to one of his sons, cash in money in a sufficient amount to pay his funeral expenses and the incidental expenses there-to, which was done by the son to whom he had turned over such money, and the amount that he thus had on hand and turned over to his son was not charged in the inventory, and no credit is asked in this report for said cost and expense. That Frank Colchin, one of the executors herein is now living and has been living in Oklahoma, since the time of decedents death, and that your executor John S. Colchin has had full charge of the administration of this estate, and that he is authorized by his co-executor Frank Colchin to make this report, and he makes this report on behalf of himself and his co-executor, Frank Colchin.

Your executors further show that all the costs and expenses of administration have been paid and distribution made to the heirs of said decedent of the surplus remaining in their hands after payment of all the debts and liabilities against said estate. That your executors make no charges for their services, that at the time of decedent's death and before that time decedent had in storage at H. H. Bremerkamp's Mill in the City of Decatur, Indiana, about Three Hundred Dollars worth of wheat, that the same was inventoried but was not charged on the inventory, and no charge was made against these executors of said amount for the reason that it was believed the same was an entire loss, and uncollectable. And your executors have endeavored to collect the same and have been unable to do so, your executors believe that said amount is uncollectable under the conditions in which said wheat was stored. Your executors further show that nothing further remains to be done in said administration.

They therefore pray that this their final report be approved in all things and that they may be discharged from any further duty or liability in said matter.
