All of which is a full statement of all the estate of the decedent for which I am chargeable with the credits to which I am entitled. The said Administrator would further Report to the Court that previous to the taking out of letters of Administration the sum of fourteen dollars of the assets of said estate was paid for a tomb stone for the decedent at the request of his widow. The Receipt whereof is herewith filed and marked No 1.

And fifty dollars was paid to Mary Kinsey one of the daughters of the decedent at the request of the said widow after his death, the receipt for the same being herewith filed signed by the said Mary's husband. No 2 \$14.00

 bond as such Administrator and as there
 is no surplus for distribution the matter is
 ordered to be left off the docket.
