Comes now the Clerk of this Court and produces the Account Current in the behalf which said Account was finally settled by the Administrator. by which it was found that said Samuel H. Nichols Adm^r of said Estate has deposited in the Clerk's office of said Court in the hands of the Clerk thereof the sum of two hundred & twenty six Dollars & ninety eight cents for distribution among the heirs of said Estate and the Court finds that notice of Distribution has not been published & posted up according to law. And that John Eley, Catharine Black, Rebecca Black, Michael Eley, Samuel Eley, Elizabeth Hays, and the children & the only children of the said Jacob Eley deceased that are living & that George Eley died leaving two children which said two children of the said George are entitled for one seventh part of said Surplus & it being made

know to the court that by the check thereof, that there remains unpaid the costs of Distribution the sum of five dollars which the clerk of orderment pay out of said surplus and the court being fully advised finds that there is the sum two hundred & twenty one dollars & ninety eight cents remaining for Distribution after deducting the said costs as aforesaid. And the court being fully satisfied from the affidavit of Michael Eley that there are only six children of the said Jacob Eley deceased living & two grand children which said Affidavit is in words & figures following to wit (A. 1.)

It is therefore ordered that the said James B Simonds clerk of the court pay the said surplus to the said heirs as follows to wit. That he pay to John Eley one seventh part of said surplus to Catherine Black and seventh part of said surplus & pay to Rosannah Black and seventh part of said surplus and pay to Michael Eley one seventh part of said surplus and pay to Samuel Eley one seventh part of said surplus and that he pay to Elizabeth Hays one seventh part of said surplus and that he pay to the heirs of George Eley deceased jointly one seventh part of said surplus. All of which is ordered adjudged & determined by the court.
