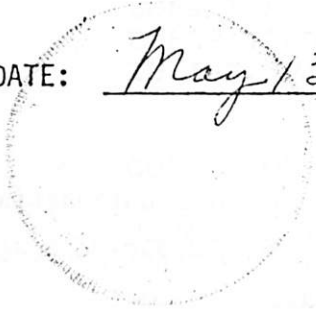

That there is now produced in Open Court and submitted to the Court and instrument in writing purporting to be the Last Will and Testament of Robert E.
